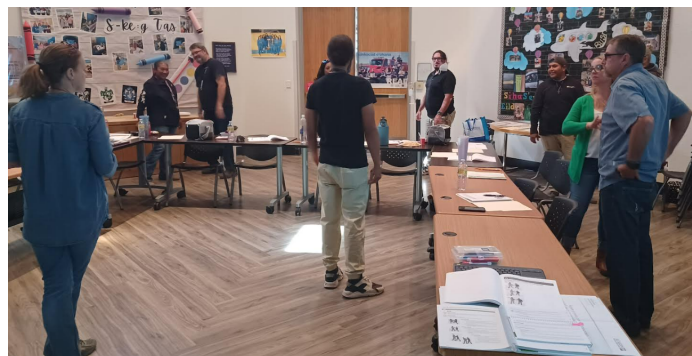

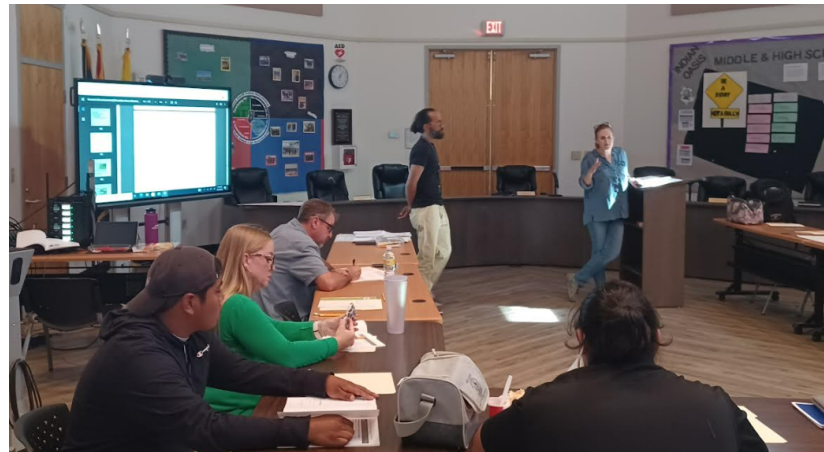

U.S. Secret Service Research and Recommendations on the Prevention of Targeted School Violence

For over 20 years, the U.S. Secret Service National Threat Assessment Center (NTAC) has conducted research on the thinking and behaviors of those who commit acts of targeted school violence, in an effort to prevent future acts from occurring. Key findings from this research indicate that establishing multidisciplinary threat assessment teams and encouraging school communities to report concerning behaviors are critical steps in the prevention of targeted school violence.

Ensuring the safety of children at school is a responsibility that belongs to everyone. To inform these efforts, NTAC will present the findings and recommendations from its most recent studies, including *Protecting America's Schools: A U.S. Secret Service Analysis of Targeted School Violence*, and *Averting Targeted School Violence: A U.S. Secret Service Analysis of Plots Against Schools*. **This presentation will also focus on how communities can use a multidisciplinary approach to identify, assess, and intervene with students exhibiting concerning or threatening behaviors as early as possible.**
